

U.S. PROBATION FOR THE DISTRICT OF MASSACHUSETTS TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

While you are on probation, parole, or supervised release in this district, you shall not travel outside of the state of Massachusetts without the permission of your probation officer. You may travel freely within the state for day trips; any overnight travel and absence from your residence while remaining in the jurisdiction for a -period over 72 hours must be approved in advance; permission may be granted verbally or in writing for this kind of travel.

For any travel outside of the jurisdiction, and within the United States, you shall request permission in writing (On specific forms provided by this office), a minimum of 14 days prior to the requested time frame.

Out-of-Country travel shall only be granted with the Court's permission. Should you wish to travel outside of the United States, you shall request permission in writing at least 60 days prior to the requested time frame. (NOTE: These are MINIMUM requirements. More time may be needed to process your travel request,.) You must obtain a letter from the consulate for the country you wish to travel to advising that they are aware of your crime of conviction and the fact that you are under supervision, and they have no objection to you traveling to their country or territory.

Travel will be denied if you are not compliant with any of the conditions of supervision. It will also be denied if your Court-ordered financial obligations (fines, restitution, or special assessments) are not completely satisfied, or you are not current with your scheduled payment plan. Pleasure travel of a significant cost will not be allowed if the payment schedule does not meet the total financial obligations that will be required during supervision.

No travel permission is granted during the first 60 days of supervision. (Emergency or extenuating circumstances can be reviewed with your probation officer.)
